

Applying Reconciliation

Canada has taken important steps to apply reconciliation principles, such as formally recognizing the United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP) and implementing the 94 Calls to Action of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) to begin a process of healing and recognize the devastation caused by the residential school system.

Arcadis IBI supports reconciliation efforts, and we believe it is an ongoing journey that provides continuous opportunities to learn and grow as a community. We recognize that through our work, we share in the opportunity to shape our world.

At Arcadis IBI, our global vision is "Improving Quality of Life by better understanding the human experience and connecting it with our scalable asset knowledge." In Canada, we are dedicated to building and growing relationships with Indigenous Peoples—not just within Arcadis IBI, but also externally with the communities we work and live in, and communities from Nation to Nation.


Indspire


Our Services at Work

ENERGY

Our Energy Solutions team develops renewable energy projects and energy plans for Indigenous communities. Building on underutilized land in effective locations, we aim to make clean energy affordable and help smooth the transition to renewable energy. We work with our clients to help them understand the development process and expand their capacity for pursuing future developments, require a percentage of our workforce on the construction of our projects be Indigenous, and provide training programs for our First Nations clients to independently market carbon dioxide credits and enhance energy sovereignty.



Our Broadband team engages with rural municipalities, Indigenous communities, and other clients to bring high-speed Internet to places that are often overlooked due to high implementation costs. We help clients secure grants and funding, design and manage the installation of fibre-optic networks, and are one of the first companies in the country to offer open-asset network management of fibre-optic systems, allowing rural and remote communities access to the digital infrastructure that they require and deserve.



ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENTS AND REMEDIATION

Our approach with First Nations communities is to actively engage community members in the environmental assessment process of their own land. Arcadis IBI supports self-determination through robust Environmental Assessments, building capacity whenever possible and working in a Nation's best interests. Our services include working alongside Nation members to provide environmental site assessment and/or remediation services to a growing number of First Nations.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Through extensive community engagement, our infrastructure team evaluates the needs of Indigenous communities to ensure services are cost effective and maximizes the integration of the community throughout all stages of a project. We partnered with Tsuut'ina Nation on the development of the Tsuut'ina Development Authority for the 1,200-acre Taza Development adjacent to Calgary, AB. As one of the largest First Nations development projects in North America, laws, regulations, policies, guidelines, as well as the development and approval of permits for all commercial and institutional developments were required.

We work with Indigenous partners to ensure Indigenous interests and expectations are at the forefront of our projects. When possible, we have Indigenous team members integrated into the design process to provide advice and oversight at all phases. Our team is working with First United and the Lu'ma Native Housing Society to redevelop their site into a universally accessible, multi-storey, purpose-built space. To address the critical housing, health, and social justice needs of the Downtown Eastside community, the building includes access to sleeping beds and showers, outdoor gathering space centred around circular ceremonial space, and using medicinal and traditional plants as part of the landscaping.
